Who can take the Galleri test?

Consider the Galleri test if you are:

- Age 50 or older.
- At increased risk for cancer due to certain lifestyle, genetic, medical, occupational, or environmental factors.
- Cancer survivors who have not had cancer in the past 3 years may also be eligible.

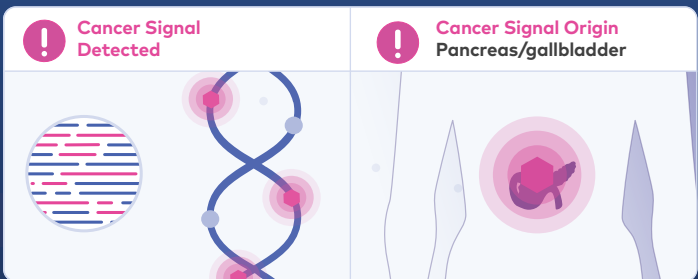

The Galleri test can tell you if you may have cancer now and tell you *where to look*

Early traces of cancer can be found in the blood. When the Galleri test detects a cancer signal, it predicts with high accuracy (93%) where in the body the signal may be coming from.⁶ This is called a Cancer Signal Origin.

The Galleri test can help your healthcare provider focus follow-up testing on the area most likely to need evaluation, which may help you avoid unnecessary tests and indicate a clearer path to answers.



The overall sensitivity in study participants with pancreatic cancer was 83.7% (61.9% for stage I, 60.0% stage II, 85.7% stage III, 95.9% stage IV); and gallbladder cancer: 70.6% (0% for stage I, 33.3% stage II, 75.0% stage III, 100% stage IV).

Confidence built on *clinical evidence*

Backed by one of the largest clinical study programs in multi-cancer early detection, the Galleri test has been studied in more than 400,000 participants across completed and ongoing studies.^{7,8} In clinical studies, the Galleri test has shown:

~4x more cancers detected when added to recommended screening.^{2*} And 2 out of 3 were detected in stages I-III,² when cancers may be more treatable.⁹

0.4% the lowest false positive rate.^{3,10} About 1 in 250 patients received a false positive result. Fewer false positives may help reduce unnecessary follow-up testing, avoidable stress, and uncertainty.

99% negative predictive value,¹⁰ meaning people with a No Cancer Signal Detected result were unlikely to have cancer during the study follow-up period.

Diagnostic testing is needed to confirm cancer. The Galleri test should be used in addition to healthcare provider recommended screening tests.

Understanding the two possible test *results*

✓ No Cancer Signal Detected

This means DNA fragments associated with cancer were not found in your blood sample.

This result does not rule out cancer. Continue all cancer screenings your healthcare provider recommends and talk to your provider about any new or unusual symptoms.

! Cancer Signal Detected

This result is not a cancer diagnosis; it means DNA fragments often associated with cancer were found in your blood sample. Your result will also include a predicted Cancer Signal Origin, which helps your healthcare provider understand where the signal may be coming from and choose follow-up testing based on that location, rather than using the same approach for every patient. About 1% of people ages 50-79 will receive a Cancer Signal Detected result.⁴

Follow-up testing may include lab tests, imaging, or other diagnostic procedures to confirm the presence of cancer.

Galleri can be taken *annually*

Aggressive cancers can develop and progress quickly, sometimes in **less than a year.**^{11,12} Each time you take the Galleri test, it looks for a cancer signal in your blood sample.

Adding Galleri to recommended cancer screenings at your annual wellness visits can improve your chance of finding cancer early.¹² Ask your healthcare provider when it is best to test again.

Important Safety Information: The Galleri test is recommended for use in adults with an elevated risk for cancer, such as those age 50 or older. The test does not detect all cancers and should be used in addition to routine cancer screening tests recommended by a healthcare provider. The Galleri test is intended to detect cancer signals and predict where in the body the cancer signal is located. Use of the test is not recommended in individuals who are pregnant, 21 years old or younger, or undergoing active cancer treatment. Results should be interpreted by a healthcare provider in the context of medical history, clinical signs, and symptoms. A test result of No Cancer Signal Detected does not rule out cancer. A test result of Cancer Signal Detected requires confirmatory diagnostic evaluation by medically established procedures (e.g., imaging) to confirm cancer. If cancer is not confirmed with further testing, it could mean that cancer is not present or testing was insufficient to detect cancer, including due to the cancer being located in a different part of the body. False positive (a cancer signal detected when cancer is not present) and false negative (a cancer signal not detected when cancer is present) test results do occur. **Rx only.**
